- **New Council appointed to lead the NMC** The Privy Council has confirmed the appointment of ten people to the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC), in addition to the existing Chair, Mark Addison. The first formal meeting of the new Council will be 23 May 2013. The NMC regulates nurses and midwives in the interests of public protection and of confidence in the professions.
