## <u>NEWS</u>

- Collaborative relationships between nurses and physicians decrease rates of healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) in critical care. According to an article in the April issue of Critical Care Nurse (CCN). The research team found that lower rates of ventilator-associated pneumonia (VAP) and central line-associated bloodstream infection (CLABSI) occurred in critical care units in which nurses reported a more favorable perception of nurse-physician collaboration. "Our findings suggest that raising the quality of collaboration and communication among nurses and physicians has the potential to improve patient safety," said study author Christine Boev, RN, PhD, CCRN. "Efforts to prevent healthcare-associated infections must include interventions to improve nurse-physician collaboration."
- **Measuring the Impact of Interprofessional Education (IPE) on Collaborative Practice and Patient Outcomes** The Institute of Medicine (IOM) convened the Committee on Measuring the Impact of Interprofessional Education on Collaborative Practice and Patient Outcomes to analyze existing data on interprofessional education's effects on healthcare delivery. The report examines the links between IPE and interprofessional collaboration and team based care. It highlights 4 areas which need to be addressed: A closer alignment between education and healthcare delivery systems; development of a conceptual framework for measuring the effects of interprofessional education; strengthening the evidence base; connecting interprofessional education to changes in collaborative behaviour. - Finding solutions together: Students approach health care as interprofessional teams. At the University of Michigan Team-based Clinical Decision Making is being offered for the first time to more than 250 students from the College of Pharmacy, School of Dentistry, Medical School, School of Nursing and School of Social Work, and is led by faculty representing each school or college. Teams of students work on challenging clinical situation scenarios that bring in their personal values and beliefs, and decisions need to be made about how to proceed as a team. The course is the beginning of a broader Interprofessional Education (IPE) effort on campus to transform the way that health professions students learn. - Doctors and Nurses, Not Learning Together. Dr Dhruv Khullar, M.D., M.P.P., reflects on how traditional education emphasizes separate training for each health professional, which inadequately prepares students and residents for new models of health care delivery that emphasize team-based care and shared responsibility for patients. Team-based care forms the foundation of novel payment models and a higher-value health care system and the training of new health professionals must reflect the evolving practice environment in which they find themselves. Thus far, our recognition that today's patients need teams has outstripped our recognition that today's teams need training. It's time to fix that together.
