- **Final report of the All Together Better Health VII conference in Pittsburgh. June 2014.** The conference involved 895 attendees, including keynote speakers, committee members, one-day registrants, scholarship-sponsored students, and University of Pittsburgh volunteers. The conference was co-hosted by the University of Pittsburgh and the National Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education. - Online interprofessional Emergency Department learning resources must clearly demonstrate value. A recent study exploring the value of technology to stimulate interprofessional discussion and education found that emergency department (ED) professionals were sceptical of efforts to use technology to enhance interprofessional education. The authors concluded that introducing online resources in the ED to support IPE and discussion should be viewed with caution. New opportunities must fill a clearly defined need, be value-added, and enhance clinical practice through consolidating and simplifying existing resources. Creating a collaborative website to improve process and function may lead to a future interactive resource for shared learning across professions. - Majority of cancer patients with depression untreated; integrated collaborative care found 'strikingly' effective. Approximately 75% of cancer patients with major depression are not receiving treatment for their depression, according to an analysis of data from more than 21,000 patients. However, a novel integrated treatment program designed specifically for cancer patients was shown to be strikingly more effective than usual care for reducing depressive symptoms and improving quality of life even in those with a poor prognosis. The new treatment programme, known as depression care for people with cancer (DCPC), is delivered by a team of cancer nurses and psychiatrists working with the patient's GP. It includes both antidepressant and psychological therapy and is given as part of cancer care. The findings were reported online Aug. 28 in the Lancet Psychiatry, the Lancet, and the Lancet Oncology
