- WHO launches the MiNDbank Mental health information at your fingertips. On 10 December 2013 GENEVA MiNDbank, a new WHO database went online, presenting a wealth of information about mental health, substance abuse, disability, human rights and the different policies, strategies, laws and service standards being implemented in different countries. It also contains key international documents and information. Launched on Human Rights Day, the platform is part of WHO's Quality Rights initiative, aiming to end human rights violations against people with mental health conditions. The database, established with support from a broad range of partners, allows visitors to tap into the health information of WHO Member States and other partners. Users can review policies, laws and strategies and search for best practices and success stories in the field of mental health. - Welsh Government proposes to establish an Intermediate Care Fund. The recent announcement of the Welsh Government's Draft Budget for 2014-15 included proposals to establish an Intermediate Care Fund. The Fund includes £35 million revenue which will be within the Local Government budget and £15 million capital funding in the Housing and Regeneration budget. This Fund provides a real opportunity to build on effective working across health, social services and housing to improve the planning and provision of more integrated services. It must drive a step change in the way services work collaboratively at both a strategic and operational level. For more information go to

- A Scottish Japanese collaboration took place in Nagoya University Japan this week promoting the work of CAIPE. Dr Sundari Joseph CAIPE board member and Mrs Jenni Haxton from Aberdeen Scotland were presenting to IPE educators within a local IPE network. The project involving the universities of Aberdeen, Robert Gordon University, Nagoya and Sendai was funded by the sasakawa foundation of Great Britain and aims to promote innovative IPE learning styles for students in both countries. An educational game which originated in Aberdeen promotes learning on professional roles and responsibilities in a fun and memorable way. This game was translated into Japanese by Drs Keiko Abe and Hyun-Jeong Park and implemented with Nagoya and Sendai students. The project team will report in March 2014 evaluating the experiences of Japanese students and make comparison with the Scottish students' experience.
- New CAIPE Membership Fees for 2014. The CAIPE Board has recently discussed membership fees for 2014 onwards. These have not been raised for over 5 years. However, in view of the increased costs from Informa for providing the Journal of Interprofessional Care and the increased costs of CAIPE overheads it is now considered necessary to increase membership fees. The Board, mindful of the present economic climate, has carefully considered situation and has agreed that the membership fees for 2014 onwards should be increased by the minimum amount required to cover CAIPE's increased costs. - **Higher Education Academy: Call to participate: working with new forms of online practice in the disciplines**. The HEA is inviting teams from higher education providers to participate in a small-scale project that explores the ways in which learners engage with the web, with a specific focus on disciplines and discipline clusters (Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences, Health and Social Care, and STEM). Each of the successful teams will meet together for two half-day workshops to explore 'resident' genres of engaging in online practice. The project will focus particularly on the characteristics of 'resident' forms of online engagement and successful teams will receive a grant of £1,500 to cover incidental expenses. - **Research funding: the impact of the shifting HE landscape on learning and teaching.** The HEA is inviting research proposals that provide insights into the impact and implications of the shifting higher education landscape for learning and teaching and the student experience in HE. The new research will build on findings from the first year of HEA investigations looking at the effects of policy changes in higher education across the UK.
