- **Welcome** to the second issue of the CAIPE electronic Bulletin edited by Lesley Hughes and Richard Pitt. The aim is to produce a monthly News e-Bulletin providing concise information and links to more in depth information, predominately on the CAIPE website www.caipe.org.uk
- Interprofessional Theory, scholarship, collaboration (formerly the International Interprofessional Theory Network) is taking forward the success of the Evolving Theory in Interprofessional Education ESRC Seminar Series. The aim is to form an international network to develop social science theory and explore its practical application, in interprofessional collaborative practice and education. The group is working in partnership with the Association for Medical Education in Europe to have a presence on their MedEdWorld website (www.mededworld.org) under Special Interest Groups. The inaugural launch of this on-line resource has been sponsored by the universities of Bournemouth, Huddersfield, Nottingham and Southampton. The on-line access will provide resources, systematic review and webinars on interprofessional theory. - Focusing on the end of life: An interprofessional learning experience (Jackson JA, Bluteau PAS, Dales RBG, Coomber J, Thistlethwaite J, Charlton R). This project, funded by NHS West Midlands, has developed, delivered and evaluated interprofessional learning opportunities for use in end of life care by undergraduate learners. Students from three professions: medicine, nursing and social work have learnt with, from and about one another, with the ultimate aim of improving collaboration and the quality of care (CAIPE 2002). The blended learning experience was developed to facilitate shared learning between the health and social care professionals undertaking the activities. Rather than learning solely from the material and reflecting on their own experiences, the learning activities were interactive; enabling students to learn together within a safe setting. The All Together Better Health conferences are the leading international interprofessional education and collaborative practice symposia. The ATBH conferences are supported by InterEd, the international association for Interprofessional Education and Collaborative Practice - a not-for-profit association. The fifth conference in the series was held in Australia in April 2010, hosted by the Australasian Interprofessional Practice and Education Network (AIPPEN). - Developing Interprofessional Education in Health and Social Care Courses in the UK A
 Progress Report: Occasional Paper 12 Health Sciences and Practice Subject Centre

 September 2011. This paper makes a valuable contribution to the articulation of the
 development of Interprofessional Education in the UK since 1997; the paper offers
 substantive arguments that will serve as a robust foundation on which to build IPE and
 collaborative practice so that services provided for individuals, families, and communities
 meet their needs efficiently and effectively.
- Requirements for interprofessional education and practice. A comparative review for health and social care
 Hugh Barr and Caroline Norrie (2010). This is a comparative review of requirements for interprofessional education and collaborative practice in regulations for pre-registration professional education for medicine, nursery and midwifery, social work and the allied health professions from the General Medical Council, the Nursing and Midwifery Council, the General Social Care Council and the Health Professions Council, and for other relevant professions provided by their regulatory bodies as information becomes available.

- Health professionals for a new century: transforming education to strengthen health systems in an interdependent world. A Lancet Commission highlights a call from 20 professional and academic leaders from diverse countries, for major reform in the training of doctors and other healthcare professionals for the 21st century. The Commission adopted a global outlook, a multiprofessional perspective, and a systems approach. Among the series of specific recommendations for reform, the Commission includes the adoption of competency-driven approaches to instructional design; the promotion of interprofessional and transprofessional education that breaks down professional silos while enhancing collaborative and non-hierarchical relationships in effective teams; and the exploitation of the power of information technology for learning. The Commission calls for a new professionalism that uses competencies as objective criteria for classification of health professionals and that develops a common set of values around social accountability.
- Transforming Interprofessional Groups through Educational Resources The TIGER project
 TIGER (funded by JISC and HEA) has collected, developed and shared reusable,
 customisable Open Educational Resources (OERs) designed for Interprofessional
 Education (IPE) in Health and Social Care between the three institutions (Northampton,
 Leicester and DMU), academics, their existing communities of practice, employers and
 the wider community in line with expressed sector requirements.
