NEWS

Corporate Forum meeting in October. Edinburgh Napier University and Robert Gordon University co-hosted the
Corporate Forum meeting in October at Edinburgh Napier University. Over 20 people attended representing 9 corporate
members and the CAIPE Board. 6 presentations from Glasgow Caledonian University, Queen Margaret University, the
Universities of Dundee and St Andrews, Edinburgh Napier University and Robert Gordon and Aberdeen Universities
showcased IPE development in Scotland.

There was very lively and informative discussion on a range of topics; about peer assessment, the role of administrators in IPE and the challenges of delivering courses designed by others, how to get commitment, and research into the relationship between academic confidence and engagement in IPE. Different types of clinical attachment and placements and the challenge in providing interprofessional learning for students in single profession HEIs were also debated. Issues around interprofessional on-line learning included how to allocate time for staff to monitor online discussion, whether the principles of virtual group learning were the same as for face to face groups, and the need for staff to be proactive in forums. • The Progress Report The 'interprofessional' in Australian health professional education: current activity and future possibilities provides an update on three connected studies focusing on the development and delivery of interprofessional education (IPE) in pre-registration health professional education in Australia.

The three studies confirmed what had previously been identified from projects engaging with Australian IPE, that is, that the development of IPE within Australian universities and jurisdictions has been: localised; opportunistic; adaptive and creative, but existing on the margins of the curriculum; minimally resourced and, as a consequence, frequently unsustainable. • Interprofessional Education: a National Audit. Report to Health Workforce Australia This report presents an analysis of pre-registration interprofessional education as this was occurring within university provided health professional education in Australia during 2011. The 'national audit' study is the first attempt within Australia and, we believe globally, to represent the kinds of aims (competencies, capabilities and learning outcomes) and activities (teaching and learning, assessment and evaluation) of Australian interprofessional education.

The study and its report are part of a suite of projects addressing the complex issues of progressing interprofessional education and practice in Australia. The other two studies are: Curriculum Renewal for Interprofessional Education in Health (funded by the Australian Government Office for Learning and Teaching, and a qualitative study, Interprofessional Education for Health Professionals in Western Australia (funded by WA Health). • How to Foster Interprofessional Collaboration Between Physicians and Nurses June 2012 In 2010, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) collaborated with the Institute of Medicine (IOM) to launch the Initiative on the Future of Nursing. In the fall of that year, RWJF convened 12 leaders from nurses' and physicians' organizations to frame a consensus document on collaboration between the two professions. In 2012, in this follow-up project, staff from the Center for Applied Research (CFAR), based in Cambridge, Mass., and Philadelphia, reconvened dialogue participants and interviewed them to glean lessons learned and suggest next steps for fostering interprofessional collaboration. Key findings noted that collaboration is improved by dialogue, interprofessional collaboration is occurring on the ground – the problem is at organisat ional level and that challenges remain in ensuring that patients are at the centre of interprofessional collaboration.
