- 'My wish for social care in 2015: a new funding settlement above all else' Isabelle Trowler, the director of Think Local Act Personal argues that person-centred care is vital to improving the sector. Her wishes for 2015 are that: 'we move from talk to action' 'joined-up, coordinated, personalised care and support through the Integrated Personal Commissioning (IPC) programme' and 'the opportunity to build on new relationships and partnerships between health, care, housing and beyond'. - Public health nursing and midwifery leadership transfers to PHE. New arrangements for public health nursing, midwifery and the allied health professions leadership will come into force from April 2015. The Department of Health and Public Health England (PHE) have announced that responsibility for public health nursing and midwifery leadership will transfer to PHE from April, replacing the current joint arrangement between the department and PHE. The new arrangements will make sure strong strategic direction is in place for the future. - The Department of Health and Department for Communities and Local Government have announced new funds to kick start joint working with the NHS and Councils. The Department for Communities and Local Government has this week provided £12 million to help join up health and social care services so that there aren't delays for people who can be safely discharged and to avoid people needing to go to hospital in the first place (perhaps because of falls or flu). The money will mean up to 3,500 more people a week will get home from hospital more quickly this winter, with the local authority putting in place carers and equipment to meet their needs, freeing up much-needed hospital beds within the NHS. - RCGP launches a video animation which promotes care planning and collaborative teamwork.
