NEWS

- The CAIPE AGM took place on the 19th June 2014. Hugh Bar, CAIPE President opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and thanked Richard Gray on an excellent first year as CAIPE Chair recognising his invaluable work in building good relationships for CAIPE with so many other organisations. Richard then presented the Chair's Annual Report which highlighted CAIPE's activities throughout the past year reflecting the range and diversity of CAIPE's involvement in national and international actions to promote, support and sustain IPE. This was followed by the business part of the meeting. In the afternoon, Hugh Barr, Marion Helme and Lynda D'Avray presented their review of interprofessional education during pre-qualifying courses for health and social care professions based on findings from a 2013 -2013 survey. This was followed by Liz Anderson (Leister University) and Frances Gordon (recently of Sheffield Hallam University) reflecting on CAIPE's role in the future of IPE. Jackline Macharia, one of the winners of the student award which enabled her to attend the All Together Better Health 7 Conference at Pittsburgh presented her winning poster. - CAIPE: Press Release Responding to challenges in interprofessional education Findings from a UK review. On the 17th June 2014 CAIPE published a nationwide review of interprofessional education (IPE) during pre-qualifying courses for health and social care professions based on findings from a 2012-2013 survey and reflective accounts by experienced interprofessional teachers followed by in depth interviews. Recommendations based on the findings calling for improvements in organisation and delivery are addressed to the universities and service organisations providing the IPE and to bodies commissioning and regulating it. - Expanded partnership pledges greater personalisation of care services. Think Local Act Personal (TLAP) is a national partnership which aims to transform the way care services are delivered. Since 2011, it has expanded its scope and announces further commitments from new organisations covering the health, housing and children's sectors. This comes on the back of renewed support from government, with further grant funding secured for the next year. TLAP's new partnership agreement 'Working together for personalised, community-based care and support 2014-17' has been published. It sets out a new vision for personalisation based on what people have said is a priority, following the enormous changes to the care and health sector since 2011.
