• AGM 2015 Review.

At CAIPE's Annual General meeting on June 18th, Richard Gray presented the Chair's Annual Review. CAIPE has continued developing its activities over the past 12 months and Richard outlined its achievements during the year. Over the past 12 months there has been an increasing national recognition of the importance of improving collaborative practice and interprofessional education (IPE) This has coincided with radical reforms led by government. CAIPE has responded at two levels: First by supporting its members in universities and practice as they revise the future interprofessional curricula and by strengthening work based interprofessional learning for those already in practice; Second by working with commissioning, educational, professional and regulatory bodies to coordinate requirements for interprofessional within professional education. - John Horder Lecture. The 7th biennial John Horder lecture took place on June 17th in the Council room at King's College London. Professor Ed Peile gave a most interesting and stimulating presentation on the Values of Interprofessionalism. He highlighted the principle of respect as a key determinant for all actions, the importance of values which guide actions and how values based practice increases mutual respect between professionals and patients and therefore improves balanced decision making in professional practice. - **Congratulations and birthday wishes to Professor Hugh Barr, President of CAIPE**. Following the Professor ed Peile's lecture, Richard Gray, Chair of CAIPE presented Hugh Barr with a book of birthday greetings from friends and colleagues from around the world in celebration of his 80th birthday.
- Making Patient-centred Care a Reality. In the Netherlands, over 2,700 medical and allied health professionals are collaborating. They are supported by an enthusiastic team at the ParkinsonNet coordination centre at the Radboud University Nijmegen Medical Centre lead by the ParkinsonNet initiators, Prof. dr Bastiaan Bloem and Dr. Marten Munneke. "The starting point is listening to patients," says Bastiaan Bloem, M.D., professor and medical director, "Patients are telling us what they can do." Truly putting patients at the center has reshaped their notion of the disease and care delivery. Listening to patients is key to designing better care plans and improving engagement. This transformative way of delivering care is advancing through ParkinsonNet, which started in the Netherlands, but recently has expanded to Kaiser Permanente and the Van Andel Institute in Grand Rapids, Michegan. Bloem firmly believes that this kind of approach can be modeled for other chronic conditions. "The patient is our ultimate guide," he says.
