Education consultation

What does the future of education look like?

Do you think nursing education will look the same in 2030 as it does today?

Over the next few years we will radically change the standards that set out how both nurses and midwives are educated.

This week the NMC <u>launched a consultation</u> to find out what you think about our proposals for the future of nursing education. And now that midwifery supervision has changed, they are also preparing our proposals for midwifery education.

Students, educators, nurses and members of the public across the UK have told them what they think will change between now and 2030, and with their help, the NMC have produced new draft standards. The draft standards include:

- draft standards for education these set out how students will be trained and educated in the future
- draft standards of proficiency these set out what nurses will be able to do when they ioin the register

• our proposals for prescribing.

These draft standards will make sure that the nurses of the future will join the profession with the skills and knowledge they will need in the future – what do you think?

HCPC releases revised Standards of education and training and guidance

The Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) has today released revised Standards of

<u>education and training (SETs) and guidance.</u> which now contain an explicit requirement that courses include interprofessional education. CAIPE was in contact with the team which conducted the review for the HCPC prior to these changes and sent feedback during the consultation process for this new standard.

The SETs are the standards against which we assess education and training programmes. A programme which meets the SETs allows learners who successfully complete that programme to meet the standards of proficiency for their profession, and are eligible to apply to the HCPC for registration.

Call for hosting the ATBH Conference in 2020

The World Coordinating Committee ATBH warmly welcomes expressions of interest from universities and health service organisations in hosting the tenth ATBH conference to be held in 2020. First held in London in 1997, ATBH conferences have met in Vancouver, London, Stockholm, Sydney, Kobe, Pittsburgh, and Oxford with Auckland to follow in 2018. The conferences bring together up to 900 delegates from around the world to promote interprofessional education towards improving global health through closer collaboration. Delegates include health and social care professionals and educators, policy makers, students and service users and carers.

Interested organisations should be an institution active in the domain of health and/or social care, or of higher education in this domain, or a regional network in IPE/CP, or a consortium of institutions be willing to work closely with a regional network represented on the World Coordinating Committee. The need to be prepared to carry full financial liability for the conference, and organize the conference according to the general guidelines and the general program schedule, over 3 days in the period to define between May and October 2020 and to be agreed with the WCC-ATBH. They need to provide an easily accessible venue for international participation with evidence of available accommodation for a minimum of 500 delegates over 3 days in the conference venue. Preferably they have a track record in interprofessional education and collaborative practice nationally and internationally. Candidates provide written support from senior managers of the organisation/s involved in the bid, and provide evidence of available accommodation for lodging of conference participants in the area around the conference venue. Expressions of interest should indicate that these criteria are met. Candidates can contact WCC members and administrators for additional information. Click here for further info.
