- NHS England has announced the Vanguard Areas for developing new models of care. The vanguard areas will
 join up mental health, primary care, community nursing, hospitals, pharmacy and social care. Nine of the 29 successful
 bidders are primary and acute care systems, while 14 are multi-specialty community providers (GP practices coming
 together with hospital specialists, community services, nurses and pharmacists to offer primary and specialist services). For

- Collaborative care may improve outcomes in childhood ADHD. This randomized trial compared basic collaborative care and enhanced collaborative care, examining individual-level outcomes in inattention, hyperactivity, oppositionality, and social skills. Evidence-based basic care consisted of primary care-led teams and care managers while enhanced care included additional training in family and social support for care managers. The study concluded that enhanced care using motivational interviewing and positive parenting techniques improved symptoms in children with attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). - **Collaborative care improves depression in teens** In a collaborative care intervention, a care manager continually reached out to teens delivering and following up on treatment in a primary-care setting (the office of a pediatrician or family doctor, not a psychiatrist or psychologist) at Group Health Cooperative. Depression outcomes after a year were significantly better with this approach than with usual care, according to a randomized controlled trial published in JAMA. - The Revised Code and Revalidation for Nurses and Midwives. The revised Code of Professional Standards of Practice and behaviour for nurses and midwives becomes effective on 31 March 2015. The Code will be central to revalidation. Nurses and midwives will need to revalidate every three years in order to remain on the NMC register.
