- Health and Care Professions Council Education annual report 2012 published. The HCPC announced the publication of the Education annual report 2012 on 7th May. The report provides an overview and analysis of the key trends from the Council's approval and monitoring activities from 1 September 2011 to 31 August 2012. The HCPC's work with new professions continues following the transfer of social workers in England from the General Social Care Council on 1 August 2012 when social work pre-registration programmes and approved mental health professional (AMHP) programmes were added to the register of approved education and training programmes... A new route to registration for clinical scientists was also approved. For the first time both education providers and placement educators were invited to attend education seminars on practice placements during 2011–12. Building on their success, additional seminars on practice placements have been held in 2012.-2013. - The Department of Health has issued a Press release about the Government's Care Bill to give people peace of mind in hospital, care homes and their own homes. Measures set out in the Care Bill, published, on 10 May, is intended to ensure that people will be treated more compassionately in hospital, see their care better joined up and be reassured that they will not have to pay astronomical care costs if they need to go into a care home in their old age. The Care Bill will help drive up quality of care following the findings of the Francis Inquiry into events at Mid-Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust. It will also include improvements to the care system following an extensive consultation with people and organisations right across the health and care system from users of services to providers of care. The Bill will create a single modern law that replaces more than a dozen pieces of legislation dating back to the post-war period. NHS England is one of the key national partners in the National Collaboration for Integrated Care and Support which has signed up to a series of commitments on how we will help local areas integrate services. Norman Lamb, said: 'People don't want health care or social care, they just want the best care. This is a vital step in creating a truly joined-up system that puts people first. Unless we change the way we work, the NHS and care system is heading for a crisis. This national commitment to working together is an important moment in ensuring we have a system which is fit for the future'. In the USA, the proposed Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) Accreditation Standard ED-19-A states: "The core curriculum of a medical education program must prepare medical students to function collaboratively on health care teams that include other health professionals. Members of the health care teams from other health professions may be either students or practitioners." The rationale for this new standard is that interprofessional education (IPE) and practice leads to improved patient outcomes, enhanced safety and quality of care.
