- Hospital Mergers and the Impact of Mobile Health Platforms. In the USA Healthcare organizations are increasingly buying physician practices and more physicians are employed by health systems than ever before. As a result, groups of physicians and healthcare workers that previously had no communication with each other, or were even competing, now find themselves working on the same team. This creates enormous challenges with aligning physicians for collaborative care. Healthcare organizations are turning to mobile health platforms to remedy this. - Cultivating Compassion In End Of Life Care: An Interprofessional Approach. Improving End of Life Care: a joint
 proposal was drawn up by Colette Hawkins, County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust, Pip Hardy, CoFounder Patient Voices and Members of the CAIPE board. The bid was made to NHS Health Education North East for the
 development, piloting and evaluation of a programme to improve the quality for end of life care. The outcome was
 successful and the project is fully funded and supported by NHS North East. A steering group was set up and the first
 meeting took place in May. The next step is to produce digital stories from service users and service providers by July

- Team discussions may help reduce medical errors. In response to the Institute of Medicine's goal to reduce medical errors, accrediting bodies including have begun developing standards of interprofessional education (IPE). Investigating which types of interprofessional [IP] collaboration result in improved outcomes will provide key data to help structure IPE training programs. At the American Academy of Physician Assistant's 2015 meeting, Elana A. Min at Rush University's College of Health Sciences in Chicago, Illinois, presented findings from a prospective pilot study which indicate that group discussions implemented as part of interprofessional education training programs significantly improved diagnostic and treatment accuracy scores among physician assistant students.
