Interprofessional Student Learning Conference at the University of East Anglia

The Centre for Interprofessional Practice (CIPP) at the University of East Anglia recently held their 11th Interprofessional Student Learning Conference. This year with the theme: "Modern Family - adapted - Health and social care in the 21st Century"

21st century families take many forms; people live multiple social and cultural contexts that affect their responses to health and social care, and their engagement with it. The conference adapt this concept, using diverse families as the backdrop for exploring interprofessional practice from early to later life taking into consideration also challenging contexts – including social disadvantage. Students were offered an interactive experience, where they could learn and work together with local professionals and people from the community.

The conference kicked off with Professor Peter Beresford OBE given a very thought provoking keynote presentation. Students then joined one out of five workshops entitled:

- From the pond to the sea: young people transitioning to adult services.
- Mental and physical health.
- Self-management: empowering, or passing the buck?
- Women across Boundaries: challenges facing women around the world.
- The ageing population.

The feedback was very good from all participants (n~200) giving the overall experience a score of 4.5 (out of 5). An IPL intervention well worth the investment.






Nordic Interprofessional Network (NIPNET) Conference: 8-9 June, Bergen, Norway.

Self-harm is often used as a coping mechanism. The physical pain of self-harm might feel easier to deal with than the emotional pain that's behind it. Over half of people who die by suicide have a history of self-harm. However, the intention is more often to punish themselves, express their distress or relieve unbearable tension. Sometimes the reason is a mixture of both. This half day workshop will give an overview of the field, known research, NICE guidance etc. and self-harm from a school's perspective.








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
