Digital stories about Interprofessional Education and Practice

Stories help people make sense of experiences – their own and others. They can be a particularly beneficial way for participants to process difficult, confusing or painful experiences, and to share those experiences with others. CAIPE members have over the years made frequent use of the Patient Voices' (www.patientvoices.org.uk) extensive catalogue of digital stories for their own work in promoting and teaching interprofessional education (IPE) and interprofessional collaborative practice.

Although there are many digital stories addressing health and social care issues, there are few that specifically address and focus upon interprofessional education, interprofessional collaboration, or teamwork. **CAIPE** has now resolved this omission and made **a resource for stories specifically relating to IPE.** A series of nine digital stories has been produced by a group of **CAIPE members** attending a Patient Voices workshop funded and sponsored by CAIPE.

Each participant has produced a rich and personal story of their journey to IPE and

PHIPEC 2018

The PHIPEC 2018 is the first-ever national conference held in the Philippines on interprofessional education and collaboration (IPEC). It was initiated through an interuniversity partnership (Angeles University Foundation [AUF] and University of Santo Tomas [UST]) to facilitate uniform understanding of IPEC across higher education institutions and health facilities as well as instigate research and curriculum creation on IPEC to facilitate improved health outcomes for the Filipino population. The historical event was held in the University of Santo Tomas

(Manila, Philippines) last 11–12 August 2018. The two-day conference gathered over 80 participants from more than 10 health and social care professions (i.e., occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech-language pathology, nursing, medicine, social work, psychology, dentistry, pharmacy, public health, health professions education). Moreover, a total of 15 speakers shared their expertise in health education and practice in light of IPEC.

<u>5 Year Action Plan For Health Employment And Inclusive Economic Growth (2017–</u> <u>2021)</u>

In its report entitled Working for health and growth: investing in the health workforce, the High-Level Commission on Health Employment and Economic Growth ("the Commission") proposed 10 recommendations and five immediate actions to transform the health and social workforce for the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Implementation of these will require game-changing interventions and action by Member States, led by ministries of health, education, employment and finance, as well as the international community.

Dismantling the long-held belief that investment in the health workforce is a drag on the economy, the Commission found that health workforce investments coupled with the right policy action could unleash enormous socioeconomic gains in quality education, gender equality, decent work, inclusive economic growth, and health and well-being. This paradigm shift provides new political impetus for Member States to implement WHO's global strategy on human resources for health: Workforce 20302 adopted by the Sixtyninth World Health Assembly in May 2016.
