GUEST EDITORIAL

At times it was tricky....sometimes it still is. Reflecting on the importance of keeping Interprofessional Education (IPE) on the agenda

IPE is in our blood at Coventry University. As the strategic lead for IPE since 2002, I have raised the profile year on year and I can safely say it is now firmly rooted in our health and social care course provision. In 2005 working across faculty we had our first fully interprofessional strategy embedded into all of our pre-registration courses – Nursing, Midwifery, Social Work, Dietetics, Paramedic Science, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Operating Department Practice, Youth Work, Rehabilitation Engineering and, by working collaboratively across universities, the medical students from Warwick Medical School. Over the years, our course profile for IPE has changed as some courses have been lost and others gained. Added to this, the changing face of the workforce is evolving, and we have responded by adding new courses that have included Nursing Associates, Assistant Practitioners and many apprentice routes.

The day job is wide and varied but as an Associate Head of School for Quality & Accreditation in a large School of Nursing, Midwifery & Health (over 4,000 health students amongst others) it's always busy. Part of my role concentrates on overseeing new course development, the periodic review, and changes to existing courses. A massive part of the role concentrates on the interaction with the professional and regulatory bodies. A large school means regular contact with the Health Care Professions Council (HCPC), Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC), General Pharmaceutical Council (GPhC), Royal College of Occupational Therapy (RCOT), Chartered Society of Physiotherapy (CSP), College of Operating Department Practice (CODP), British Dietetics Association (BDA), and the College of Paramedics (CoP). Not to mention recent developments in the School which have led to conversations with new professional bodies.

The course approval, periodic review, major change (HCPC) and major modification (NMC) experience has changed progressively over the years. The revision of standards of education and training (SETs) and Standards of Proficiency (SoPs) at regular intervals shine a light on what is current in health and social care and key areas to scrutinise. If I think back to the 2005, 2008 and 2013 course approvals, huge emphasis was placed on IPE in the approval meetings. Many questions were asked and obvious concern raised regarding the impact of an embedded interprofessional curriculum across all preregistration courses. At times it was tricky, compromises were made, and the delicate negotiation that was undertaken to ensure we could engage in interprofessional activity became easier over the years, but still a suspicion from the professional and regulatory bodies was evident. How would this impact on the professional course? It seemed at times that the obvious (to us) enhancement was not perhaps obvious enough in the approval events and we had to work hard to make it clear.

Over the last two years, we have undertaken a major review of all our current preregistration courses as well as introducing new pre-registration Masters courses. We have undertaken in excess of 20 separate approval events across the range of our professional and regulatory bodies, with another 5 in the next few months. The notable issue is that interprofessional education is now clearly part of SETs, and SOPs and associated standards. Yet the questioning has been minimal; it seems that there has been an acceptance that the course development process to support these developments has been sound and does not require interrogation. While this is satisfying, indeed some might say that my job in this area is complete, yet I would have welcomed the opportunity to discuss and defend. We have not been complacent at Coventry, a year was taken to review and revise the interprofessional strategy prior to the reviewed 2018 curricula going live. Colleagues leading on the operationalisation of IPE looked closely at the 2013 interprofessional strategy and evaluated what had worked well and what could be improved. Colleagues and students from all professional groups were included in this process to ensure all professions were on board and were happy to embed the revised interprofessional activities into their new courses.

In approaching the approvals events we were ready, IPE was mapped. However, the world of health and social care education had moved on and the emphasis in this round of approvals was predominantly around apprentice routes and practice – would the apprentices have a comparable experience to full time students? Where would students be placed? Was there capacity for the rising numbers demanded to meet workforce targets? IPE was already embedded, clearly mapped and articulated through the strategy. The professional and regulatory bodies accepted this, they were aware of our record of accomplishment, knew we were committed and when it was clear it was, that was accepted. While that is obviously gratifying it is also slightly unsettling in that to keep interprofessional education firmly on the agenda at a professional and regulatory level it needs to be centre stage, it needs to be on the approval agenda and be subject to scrutiny.

It is worthy of note that by IPE being taken for granted it is in danger of becoming less visible, just another element of each curricula. The importance of keeping it firmly on the agenda is that it does not become just symbolic. Students and colleagues need to be clear regarding why IPE is so important. To understand why is it essential to learn with, from and about each other. To increase meaningful interprofessional activity within the curricula, to raise its profile and to continue to keep it firmly on the agenda we need to be raising the bar, looking for new opportunities and innovative ways of engaging students on campus and in practice. To ensure students and colleagues really understand the importance of how working interprofessionally enables a compassionate, joined-up care experience for all involved.

CAIPE members help to propel Interprofessional Education in Germany. Reflection by Professor Liz Anderson and Professor Cornelia Mahler



It is interesting to reflect that such an advanced economic nation as Germany has such a different healthcare system to that of any other European country. We must all recognise that over the years of alliances with our European Networks there has often been few colleagues from Germany. This is because they are modernising what have been very traditional hierarchical system of healthcare delivery and as a country they are just beginning challenge this culture. One area of notable change is the beginning of degree level training for professions outside of medicine. Nurses in Germany train in colleges and are embarking on professional entry at degree level bringing them into Higher Education Institutions for the

first time. The first-degree nursing courses in the UK began over 50 years ago with all nurses offered this pathway following the changes known as 'Project 2000'. Despite a very medically dominated system with regional reporting systems (no national system for healthcare) there has been a plethora of activity to propel Interprofessional Education (IPE) in Germany. CAIPE has been playing a central role in this and many IPE champions in Germany have been CAIPE members. In 2018 a Canadian link with Berlin led to one of the first IPE text books published in German entitled "Interprofessionelles lernen, Lehren und Arbeiten" [Interprofessional learning, teaching and working], editors Micahel Ewers, Elise Paradis and Doreen Herinek. Within the publication are chapters from authors in Canada, as well as the UK (Elizabeth Anderson chapter page 154 entitled "Taking Interprofessional Education into Practice Settings'). To forward this amazing work Germany has established a network similar to CAIPE, currently led by Dr Sylvia Kaap, which is a working group within the German Association for Medical Education (similar to the Association for Medical Education in the UK- ASME). This group also involves other German Speaking Countries. CAIPE network members, for example Professor Cornelia Mahler, Germany and Professor Marion Huber from Switzerland, are active participants involved in pushing the network forward. In September 25th 2019, this network met at the annual conference of the German Association for Medical Education where the overarching theme for the first time was - 'Interprofessiona Education'. At the conference the local champions for IPE had one of their biannual meetings. However, the number of representatives and interested conference participants had doubled in size and the thirty-one gathered members had to move to a larger the room. This bodes well for the developments and leaps they are making towards interprofessional patient-centred education and practice. The invited keynote speaker was Professor Elizabeth (Liz) Anderson; the Key note address was entitled "Interprofessional Education: working together in the era of complexity".

The conference demonstrated in many sessions, presentations and posters the large number of research and teaching projects addressing IPE in the German speaking countries at medical schools. It seemed for a short moment that the topic is top on the education agenda. It was great to see how many different health professions participated in the conference and were involved in shaping the programme altogether.

Later in October, Berlin, the authors of the first text book on IPE in Germany, Michael Ewers and Doreen Herniek (Elise



Paradis was unable to attend) held a Symposium to raise awareness of IPE. Building on their Canadian links the keynote was given by Cynthia Whitehead with Sylvia Langlois talked about the IPE programme in Toronto Canada. CAIPE was also present with workshops led by Andreas Xyrichis with Jayne Frisby and Liz Anderson.



CAIPE remains a source of support. In recent years Professor Cornelia Mahler has worked with Professor Scott Reeves and in 2012 Elizabeth Howkins delivered a keynote at the GMA conference

2020 is the WHO International Year of the Nurse and the Midwife



The TUFH Institute is committed to addressing the needs of the most vulnerable populations by creating communication and knowledge sharing e-learning platforms for global and national interprofessional and intersectorial communities of practice that build each participants respective

capacity. The TUFH institute is guided by the values that all teach and all learn and we all learn best by doing. Using proven adult learning techniques and interactive video technology, TUFH Taskforces connect health providers with specialists in regular real-time collaborative sessions. The sessions, designed around case-based learning and mutual coaching, help Global and Regional Participants gain the knowledge and skills required to improve upon existing models and services. Health care participants gain skills and confidence. Global experts receive critical feedback that influences their policy and system recommendations.

TUFH's Institute includes 3 components:


- 1. Knowledge Sharing: Global Thought Leaders share their knowledge and expertise through curated 10-15 minute lecture videos and carefully selected relevant published articles.

- 3. Communities of Practice: Global Thought Leaders and Practitioners will convene monthly, via Zoom Software leveraging interactive video technology, to mutually learn resulting in improved global and country policies and health services delivered from local people they know and trust.


