A New Year is always a time of hope, new beginnings and a time for reflection.

As your Joint Chairs we look forward to the co-creation of a new strategy for CAIPE (June 2022 – 2027). This will drive our direction for the next five years and provide focus for our working activities.

Developing CAIPE's new strategy will take time as we review the changing interprofessional landscape, widely consult and obtain buy-in from CAIPE members and its stakeholders. We have begun this process by working with Leadership Team and the Board to clarify our mission and vision, namely that CAIPE is a scholarship organisation, researching and publishing in the field of interprofessional education and collaborative practice. The outcome of our scholarship aims to influence health and social care policy for the improvement of health outcomes for all. CAIPE will continue to disseminate its scholarship through conferences and workshops as we reach out to our colleagues in education and training.

We remain optimistic about the new UK opportunities available to CAIPE this year, as integrated care systems are established across the country. Their prime function is to meet health and care needs by joining up services across an area to improve the population's health and reduce inequalities between different groups.

We are also fortunate to have taken over the Chair of CAIPE at a time when the global community of interprofessional education experts, seek to come together around a global mission, to propel interprofessional learning to improve health for all. As the network begins to re-organise its working direction we will be announcing opportunities for CAIPE members to support this initiative. CAIPE, as a global partner, will offer all members, university faculties and NHS organisations access to this wider global movement.

This is indeed a time to be scholarly, ask questions and demonstrate the value of interprofessional learning, especially in practice.

We end our Chair's report with sad news. As we start the New Year the international interprofessional community lament the death of Dr DeWitt C. "Bud" Baldwin, at the age of 99 years on 5th January, 2022. Along with a distinguished medical career in the USA, Bud as he preferred to be called, was an early pioneer of IPE and was known to many here in the UK including Professor Hugh Barr and Dr John Horder. DeWitt C. "Bud" Baldwin Jr., MD Remembered



Reared in India, Bud's missionary parents worked with doctors which he cited long after as his first experience of teamwork. His childhood and early theological training instilled lasting spiritual values reflected throughout his distinguished career as a physician and psychiatrist stressing his enduring concern with the wellbeing of his fellow doctors and interprofessional relationships.

He visited France frequently with Michelle, his French wife, the UK less often, memorably as a keynote speaker at the first ATBH conference. Pressed to demonstrate how IPE could improve collaboration and quality of care, Bud asserted that there were three classes of knowledge: Great Truths, Truths and Science. Interprofessional education was a Great Truth awaiting scientific confirmation.

One of the first to build bridges between interprofessional initiatives internationally, Bud wrote fulsomely about UK developments (Journal of Interprofessional Education Vol 21, Supp. 1. 2007). Our paths crossed frequently at North American interprofessional conferences when he was always keenly interested in learning how the 'Brits' were faring.





The framework in now more than 10 years old and was created at a time when the focus in health care and the education of health providers may have been different than that of today.


