

Our four-month consultation on new post-registration education standards is open. The draft standards build on ambitions for community and public health nursing in the UK.

Professor Geraldine Walters CBE, our Executive Director of Professional Practice, said: "This is the time for you to tell us what you think and to help shape the proposals by letting us know what needs to be added, taken away, or changed.

"We're grateful to everyone who has shared their views so far, and we want to hear from even more people during the consultation. This will help us support the community and public health nurses of the future along with the millions who will need their care."

You and your colleagues can get involved by visiting our <u>webpage</u>. We're also hosting <u>virtual</u> <u>drop-in sessions</u> and <u>webinars and virtual panel events</u>. The consultation is open until 2 August 2021.

Register at record high but data shows notes of caution





Read our reports

We've published our <u>annual registration data report</u> for April 2020 to March 2021. The data shows that the number of professionals on our register has risen to almost 732,000, our highest ever. And the number of people leaving our register is the lowest in five years. But there are notes of caution, too.

Andrea Sutcliffe, our Chief Executive and Registrar, said: "While our register shows welcome and much needed positive UK growth overall, the pace of that growth has slowed. We've also seen the continued reliance on international recruitment, which makes us vulnerable to the impact of world events, as the early months of the pandemic showed."

Education emergency and recovery standards

Recently, our Council discussed whether to remove the emergency and recovery standards that we put in place in response to the Covid-19 emergency. They approved recommendations to withdraw standards allowing final year students to do extended placements and first year students to learn in a theoretical environment.

The Council also reviewed the recovery standard allowing student nurses to practise and learn in simulated environments for up to 300 hours, where conventional clinical practice wasn't possible. This will stay in place and be reviewed in six months' time. We'll keep you informed of any further updates to these standards when we can.



Ambitious for Change part two

We've launched the second phase of our equality and diversity research called <u>Ambitious for Change</u>. This forms part of our work to find out why people with certain protected characteristics experience our processes differently.

Andrea Sutcliffe said: "We've made some good progress so far, but there's still a long road ahead. We want to make a difference for the benefit of the nursing and midwifery professionals we support and the public we're here to serve."

We'll publish a final report on this work in the autumn and will keep you up to date with our next steps.

Preparing professionals for the new Test of Competence

This August, we'll be introducing the updated Test of Competence (ToC) reflecting our new standards for nurses and midwives. We've created a dedicated ToC web hub with <u>all of the information candidates need</u>. Candidates can find test specifications, blueprints, handbooks, practice tests and more. Please share these resources with your colleagues.

Our contracts with OSCE test centres are also ending in February 2022. We're tendering for new contracts and we'll be addressing feedback about how we can improve and make tests more accessible. We'll keep you updated on our progress.

Supporting nursing associates to revalidate for the first time

Nursing associates (NAs) will be able to revalidate for the first time from November 2021. We'll be providing case studies and other supporting materials in the coming weeks to help NAs as they go through the process for the first time. We've moved our guidance, documents and form templates <u>onto our main website</u>. The pages might look a bit different, but the information remains the same.

We'll also be holding a webinar in the near future to provide further support and emailing professionals with detailed support materials, in the run up to their revalidation. We hope you'll find this information useful as educators. Please share this information with your colleagues and any professionals who you think need to know about this.

We've approved the South Devon College as the first further education (FE) institution in England to teach the nursing associate (NA) programme. This is the first time a FE college has been approved to run this type of course in its own right.

Dr Alexander Rhys, our Assistant Director of Professional Practice, said: "This is a fantastic step for both South Devon College and the NMC in helping aspiring professionals achieve the nursing associate qualification in the most safe and effective way possible. I hope they will be the first of many colleges seeking direct approval to run a nursing associate programme."

Update on our programme standards education survey

EU law no longer applies to our standards, so we launched a survey to help us decide whether or not we should change our nursing and midwifery education programme standards.

Thank you to everyone who shared their views with us. We received 6,266 responses and an independent research organisation is now analysing the feedback. We'll keep you updated on our progress and whether we propose make changes to our programme standards.

UK-REACH study on Covid-19 vaccine hesitancy

We've responded to the UK-REACH study about Covid-19 vaccine hesitancy among health and care workers. It was the largest research project looking at the impact of Covid-19 on ethnic minority health and care workers. The study found that those from some minority ethnic backgrounds were more reserved about getting the vaccine.

Andrea Sutcliffe said: "We know the Covid-19 vaccine helps to keep us safe from this awful virus. These findings are another important step to help us understand what we all need to do to support professionals, particularly those from ethnic minority backgrounds, to take up the vaccine, whenever it's appropriate."


PAHO completes the pilot project on malaria pharmacovigilance in Brazil

Introducing the INCAREHEART PCP Project!



We are pleased to announce an exciting new project funded by the European Commission through the Horizon 2020 Programme. The <u>INCAREHEART</u> project is a European H2020 Pre-Commercial Procurement (PCP) of innovative ICT-enabled integrated care solutions, aiming to advance multidisciplinary health and care for patients with Chronic Heart Failure (CHF).Heart failure is a complex condition, covering a whole spectrum of care including acute care and long-term care with in-hospital, outpatient and community-based care and support. Integrated management and multidisciplinary care are thus essential to provide optimal heart failure care, reducing hospital (re)admissions and providing better outcomes and experiences for patients and carers. However, many patients across Europe do not receive optimal treatment and care through an integrated heart failure management programme. Major areas of concern to patients and carers are the lack of continuity between hospital and home as well as the coordinated treatment of comorbidities.

Five INCAREHEART public procurers will jointly procure an ICT-enabled integrated care solution to effectively support the management of a multidisciplinary care and support model for people living with CHF. Building on the partial advances seen in integrated health and care delivery, for the first time a range of features will be integrated into a modular solution to effectively bring different care providers, family carers, and patients into a shared CHF care pathway cutting across diagnosis, acute care and jointly managed long-term care.


