Hopefully some of these activities will support you during the lockdown and we are always keen to hear from members and receive material for the newsletter.



STRATUS x Chengdu First People's Hospital




As the first element of an ongoing relationship between Brigham Health International and the Chengdu First People's Hospital (CFPH) in Sichuan Province in the People's Republic of China, STRATUS has been consulting to expand the scope and quality of their simulation offerings and the size of their

center.

CFPH is a 3000-bed academic medical center with a long history of providing high-quality allopathic and traditional Chinese medical care and education. Although the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated a change in approach, the project has continued on track and the new center will open in November. The STRATUS team has assisted in curriculum and faculty development, center design, and development of an operational infrastructure to support the center. The goal is for CFPH to be a fully-accredited simulation center and a leader in Chinese medical education and simulation-based research. Leaders and staff from CFPH will be traveling to Boston as soon as COVID-19 enables them to take part in an immersive educational experience. STRATUS has been providing consultation and education from a distance using on-line technologies. Deb Navedo has worked with faculty from CFPH on curriculum design and simulation-based teaching. In the picture, faculty in Chengdu are undergoing training in simulation-based education. The STRATUS team will be traveling to China annually to provide on-site education and consultation. This is one of several global consultations that STRATUS has performed.

A team lead by Dr. Roger Dias, MD, PhD, MBA (PI) and Dr. Charles Pozner (Co-I), of the Neil and Elise Wallace STRATUS Center for Medical Simulation, were among six research teams selected for funding by the Translational Research Institute for Space Health (TRISH) to support NASA's Human Research Program.

The winning projects aim to develop novel solutions to some of NASA's highest-priority risks to human health and performance during deep-space exploration missions. STRATUS's project, "*Mixed Reality (MR) Care-Delivery Guidance System to Support Medical Event Management on Long-Duration Exploration Missions*," will build on the team's past and ongoing work to develop training programs at STRATUS to help astronauts manage medical emergencies in space. This is a 2-year project.

As a partner to NASA's Human Research Program, TRISH helps solve health challenges facing human deep-space exploration. The institute funds disruptive, breakthrough research and technologies that can reduce risks to astronaut health and performance. Funding is through a cooperative agreement between NASA and Baylor College of Medicine, and includes consortium partners Caltech and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Ethicon Education Grant

For the 3rd year, the educational granting arm of Ethicon, Inc a subsidiary of Johnson & Johnson, has provided STRATUS with an in-kind grant of over \$40,000 of surgical materials to support programs at the simulation center. This grant enables students, trainees, and others to learn and practice surgical skills in the safe learning environment that our simulation center provides. They subsequently bring this enhanced competence to the clinical environment where they can master the skills they've learned under the guidance of their clinical instructors.

CRICO Grant

Maddy Pearson, DNP, RN, NEA-BC, BWH Chief Nursing Officer and Charles Pozner, MD, FSSH, Executive Director of STRATUS are co-principal investigators for a \$200,000 grant provided by CRICO to deliver interprofessional team training at BWH. All newly-hired staff on the BWH main campus who have patient care responsibilities on inpatient units and procedural areas will attend a twohour simulation-based team training program led by specially-trained physician and nurse faculty during their hospital orientation. This includes MDs, RNs, APPs, PCAs, and other allied health professionals. Ineffective communication has been found to have a substantial impact both on the quality of care and staff satisfaction. Data is being collected to establish whether this training improves patient care, as well as staff and institutional safety culture. This is the first program of its kind in the world to provide all newly-hired clinical staff with this important training.

Welcome Asma Arabi



The importance of sustainable health workforce with the right combined skills is increasingly recognised in Europe. Skill mix for health professionals refers to the "the mix of posts in the establishment; the mix of employees in a post; the combination of skills available at a specific time; or alternatively, it may refer to the combinations of activities that comprise each role" (WHO, 2000). There is an increasing body of research assessing the policy, planning, implementation and realisation needs of Skill Mix and Competency Based Policy Making which is proving that changes to policy regarding the health workforce as whole can have beneficial outcomes for healthcare systems. This Working Group will aim to increase participants knowledge, improve their tools and assist them in succeeding in achieving a higher effectiveness in health workforce planning processes and policy. 

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


